



**Sugarloaf Quilt
by Debby Kratovil**

Technique: Magic Stax©

Skill Rating: Advanced Beginners

Block Size: Approximately 8-1/4"

Number of Blocks in Quilt: 24

Quilt Size: 53-1/2" x 62-1/2"

Sugarloaf resembles a traditional block, but there is nothing traditional about the way it is sewn. It is a method I devised in order to play with a stack of batik squares I received in a guild swap. I call it Stack, Slice, Shuffle & Sew (or Magic Stax© for short). It is an easy method using any simple block line drawing to create your own set of fun, fast and creative blocks.

NOTE: for each set of 6 blocks you will need 6 DIFFERENT fabrics. You can repeat the use of your fabrics in sets of 6.

KITS of (12) precut 10-1/2" batik squares will be available for \$14.00 each.

Materials you will need for THIS quilt...

24 Block quilt - 4 x 6 blocks

Twenty-four (24) different batik 10-1/2" squares (OR other bright cotton fabric - good quality)
3/4 yard dark fabric for sashing/inner border
1-3/4 yard border print (includes binding)
(4 - 6) 10-1/2" squares of freezer paper - please try to have this precut (I will have a limited supply on hand)

Materials you will need for a smaller quilt (41" x 47")

12 Block quilt - 3 x 4 blocks

Twelve (12) different batik 10-1/2" squares (OR other bright cotton fabric - good quality)
1/2 yard dark fabric for sashing/inner border
1-1/4 yard border print (includes binding)
(3 - 4) 10-1/2" squares of freezer paper - please try to have this precut (I will have a limited supply on hand)

Optional 12-1/2" square ruler is helpful (you can use a kitchen tray or a clean pizza box)

Basic sewing and cutting supplies (mats, cutters, rulers, thread, scissors, pencil, etc)

Please practice sewing an ACCURATE 1/4" seam before our class. Do NOT bring a sewing machine you've never sewn with before or one you are not familiar with.
