President's Message

Fellow Quilters,

Welcome to a new quilt guild year in Northern Virginia. Quilters Unlimited is now an organization with twelve chapters and over a thousand members. In this, my first letter of the 2004-2005 year, I highlight the volunteer nature of our organization and express my personal appreciation for the thousands of hours freely given by individual members.

We could not support our organization's stated mission, "to preserve the tradition, culture and history of quilting, and to promote the knowledge and understanding of the art of quilting through continuing education services for members and public education activities," without volunteers. Demonstrations at Sully Plantation and all of the effort that goes into putting on our annual quilt show support our public education goals, while the fall and spring seminars and workshops represent but a fraction of the continuing education opportunities available to members.

To help achieve our organizational mission, each chapter participates by performing a specific job taken from a list that changes each year. A great deal of consideration goes into making up this list, and factors such as chapter size and available resources are taken into account. But, in the final analysis, it's individual volunteers who accomplish the myriad tasks that need to be done.

This fall we look forward to beginning our quilting year with the show at Sully Plantation. The Falls Church chapter will be providing volunteers to demonstrate quilting techniques. The fall seminars will feature Rachel Clark, and volunteers from Burke and Annandale will help ensure their success. Our goal is to have large audiences for both seminars, so please mark your calendars and plan to attend.

In addition to providing your time and energy, whether to support or attend QU activities, your ideas as to how we can find new means of achieving our organization's mission or better support its' members are certainly welcome. If you have ideas that you want to bring to the Executive Board's attention, please communicate them to your chapter president or get in touch with me. We are volunteering our time for QU, and you – the individual members - are QU.

I look forward to the coming year and all the activities that are planned. I only ask that you take time to participate in as many of these activities as possible, volunteer to assist in some if you are able, and remember that you and your fellow quilters make the entire program possible.

Financial Report

Chapter Assignments were discussed. Motion passed last September giving two (and now three with the addition of Haymarket) chapters a “bye” each year on assignment other than the quilt show. Bonnie Wilbur suggested that the “byes” be given to the chapters involved with set-up and layout for the quilt show. A new rotation of assignments will be sent out before the next meeting.

Spring Seminar/Annual Meeting: Date changed from the original April date to May 5 with workshops on May 6 and May 7.

Winter Quilt-In to be scheduled by Fairfax. Wanted to try for a Sunday. Discussion: there is a much higher cost if a school facility is used on Sunday.

Sully Plantation Quilt Show and Sale

The Sully Plantation Quilt Show and Sale takes place on Sunday, September 12 from 10 am to 4:30 pm. Each year, the organizers of the quilt show invite the members of Northern Virginia Quilters Unlimited to participate as an additional attraction at the show. QU continues to volunteer at the show as it provides us with a venue to educate the public about quilting, one of the requirements for maintaining our non-profit status with the IRS. At the show we also provide membership information about each chapter and begin the sale of raffle tickets for the QU raffle quilt. Although last year the weather couldn't have been better for a couple of quilting outdoors with friends, the Sully Plantation Quilt Show and Sale is a rain-or-shine event. However, in case of inclement weather, we are provided the use of two tents: one for the demonstration area and one for the "sit-and-sew" tent. Rachel D.K. Clark is a contemporary folk artist, teacher and lecturer who comes from a long line of sewers, beginning with her great-grandmother. She has been doing wearable art for over thirty years and teaching on the national circuit for twelve years. Eclectic fabric mixes, vibrant designs, and a keen sense of humor characterize Rachel's work.

While her garments and quilts can be whimsical, political or a personal statement it always reflects her love of traditional quilt making. She has done many one-woman shows around the country and her work has been featured in various gallery shows, magazines such as Threads, and "The Quilting Quarterly" on HGTV's Simply Quilts. 10:00 a.m. Everybody Get de Blues Sometimes - A reflection and celebration of Rachel's love for the color BLUE. All of the garments in this fashion show are blue, have blue as the predominant color, or have blue in them for a particular reason. In this show Rachel shows you why she loves to be blue!

7:30 p.m. Clothing for the Body and the Soul - A fashion show accompanied by anecdotes on the hows and whys of Rachel-made garments. The show will include a variety of garments: ensembles, coats, jackets, vests and dresses.

Rachel Clark Workshops

Thursday, Sept. 30, 2004, 9:30 a.m. to 4:30p.m. – The Collection Coat

Cost: \$40.00 (Class Limited to 18 Students)

CLASS DESCRIPTION: This workshop is designed to use the material that sewers inevitably collect over the years: the old quilt blocks, the rescued doilies, scarves, lace, buttons, and other odds and ends. Students bring their scraps to Rachel and she will help them to combine these treasures into a wearable garment using the coat pattern of their choice. The design and layout of the garment will be determined by what the student wants to highlight. The final look may be eclectic or orderly, depending on each student's preferences. Sewing experience is preferred, but beginners are welcome too.

Saturday October 2, 2004, 9:30 a.m. to 4:30p.m. - Picture This Vest

Cost: \$40.00 (Class Limited to 18 Students)

CLASS DESCRIPTION: Students use Rachel's pattern, the "Picture This" Vest Pattern, or bring their own, to create a wonderful and unique vest. This class explores building a vest around a batik panel, large-scale novelty or pictorial fabric, quilt block, mola, and other ethnic textile. Sewing experience is recommended, but beginners are welcome too.
