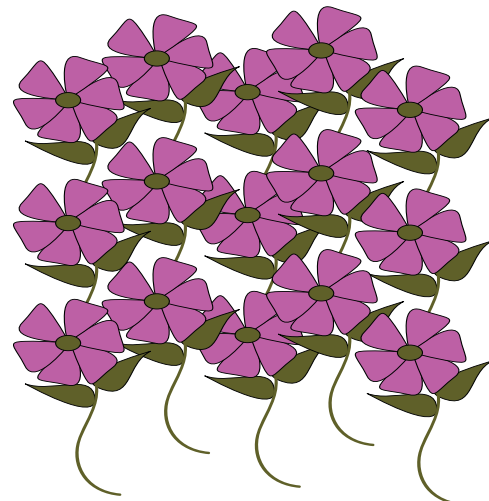

"Africa Is Life Changing" Project

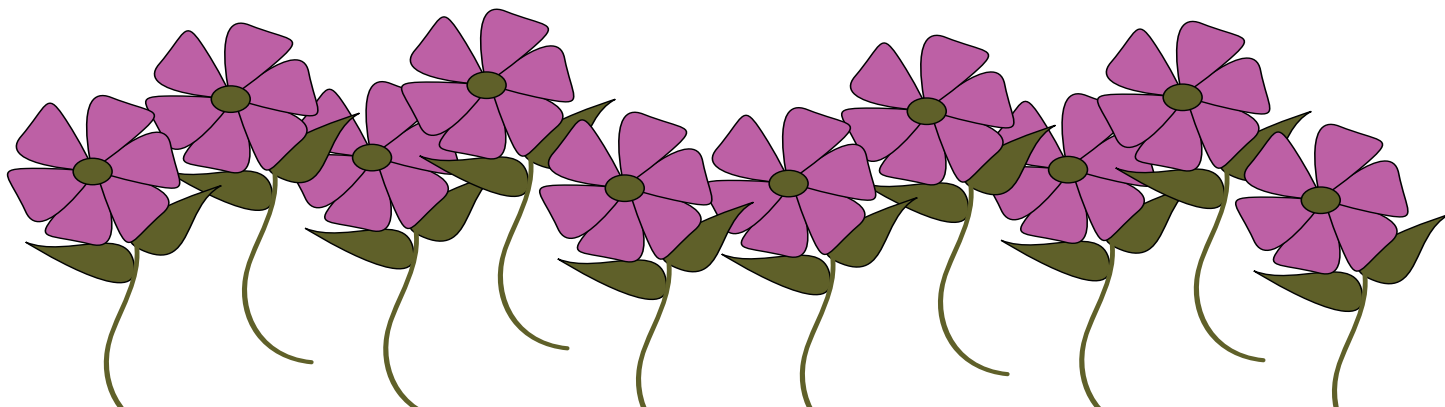
Thanks to everyone who cut and donated 12 inch squares for the Africa project. It was a humbling experience to see the generosity and kindness of BQU members in action.
