PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Dear Quilters,

Summer is the time I enjoy getting on the road to visit new quilt shops, as I did the day I write this letter. We found a nice new (changed ownership) quilt shop in Stephens City (just north of the junction of Rts. 66 and 81) called Bobbin Along Quilts. Not too many fabrics, but we liked what she had and I got some new tools. I also thought she had a good selection of batting.

Finding new quilt shops and new tools, or unusual fabrics really brightens a day for me. Finding a shop owner who knows a lot about quilting and can make really on-target suggestions for the right fabric or tool to fill a hole for me is something I appreciate. I'm glad that fabrics are available on the internet for those times when I can't find what I want, but I really prefer to see and touch what I buy, to have classes and congenial groups available to learn with, and to be able to discuss a variety of top quality tools instead of whatever is cheapest, which is what I usually find in a discount store or large craft store. So quilt shops aren't always the cheapest way to make a quilt, but they sure are the most fun.

Summer is also the time to focus on some projects we don't always have time for during the year. Block of the month samplers and summer challenge projects will be featured at September's show and tell. Bees are busy putting together November Centreville auction quilts, quilters are looking for things in their stash to sell which other quilters will want to buy, and all of us are telling friends and neighbors to start now to anticipate buying quilts and other holiday presents at our November auction.

Colin Powell Elementary School says we are cleared for the redwork bee (an open bee, so bring other projects if you just want the company) on July 21 and August 18 in the cafeteria from 7:00 to 9:00.

Patti Prevallet has our first workshop planned for August 20 at the library, to start a simple quilt which could be a good community service quilt and is certainly a great way to use up scraps of fabric. She has a full list of people who plan to participate, so be sure to let her know if you can't come or if you want to be on the waiting list.

Now is the perfect time to register for the QU Digest, an online newsletter which will keep you up to date with quilt happenings around the area. Just send an email to QUDigest@cox.net and give Barb your first and last name, email address and chapter affiliation to subscribe. Your email address is not used for any other reason and you can unsubscribe at any time. It will remind you of great happenings around the area, like the Quilt Odyssey show in Hershey, PA, coming up on 28-31 July. You can also read these newsletters in the library without an email account; just call me for the access information.

If you want a suggestion about what to make for November's auction or would like to help on the committee, please call Joan Unkel or Barbara Powers. That committee will be busy by August, listing items contributed and deciding on the order in which they will be auctioned, along with all the other numerous small decisions to be made. I hope you borrowed a good quilt book from our library for the summer and are having lots of fun putting something new together. I can't wait for the fun of September when we get together to share it all!

Sewing the strips together using a walking foot helps prevent "directional" distortion. This would also be a great time to "start" your auction contribution!!
