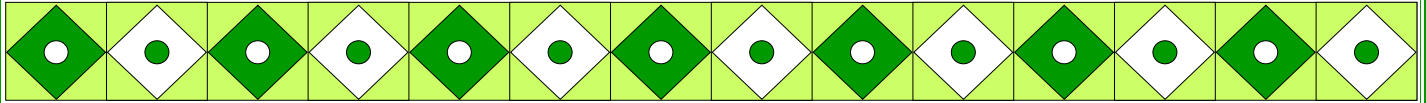

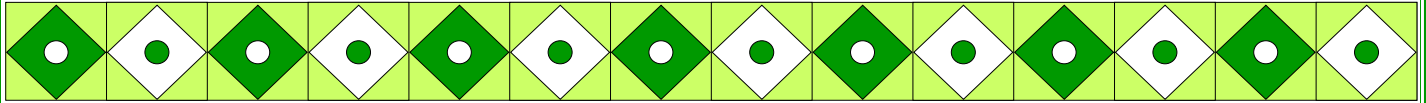

### 2009 QU SHOW - SETUP AND TAKEDOWN "WE CAN DO IT!!!" IS OUR MOTTO Please Volunteer for Setup and/or Takedown

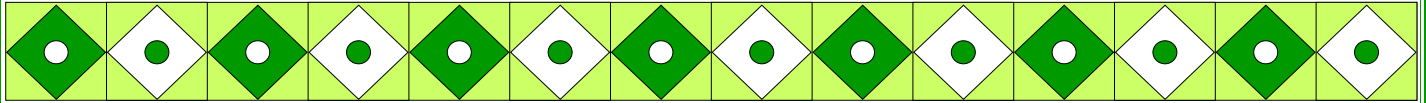
- We need the help of husbands/significant others/sons/daughters/& their friends too! Workers between ages of 18-28 will be paid \$12/hr. They need to sign up advance with Pat Blood (see contact info. below).
- A BONUS of \$35 to the paid workers who work a shift Wed. OR Thursday AND WORK SUNDAY EVENING TAKEDOWN also!
- Quilters' kids age 16 & up – who are STRONG & "STURDY" may work as porters for the vendors. Vendors pay them separately.
- If you sign up we'll send you a reminder with instructions, directions, etc.

#### SETUP/TAKEDOWN DATES & TIMES:

- **LOAD TRUCK Wed 4:30 pm June 3:** At storage facility near Expo Center, load the show equipment into truck. (There is lots of it - poles, drapes, ladders, garment stands, tools, signs and more.) This takes about 2 hours. Truck driven to Expo Center & parked.
- **SET UP Thurs 8:00 am June 4:** truck driven into Expo Center, unloaded and teams set up poles, hang drapes and once quilts arrive, help hang quilts section by section.
- **SET UP Thurs 1:00 pm June 4:** Quilt Collectors arrive with quilts and teams hang them according to the Layout Committee's plans. Quilts should all be up by 6:00 pm.
- **TAKEDOWN Sunday 3:45 pm June 7:** Show closes at 4:00, - Doors locked until quilts are taken down and accounted for. Poles and drapes come down, all equipment collected and put back into the truck which is driven back to storage facility.
- **RELOAD THE STORAGE SHED:** everything is taken out of the truck and put back into the shed.

**NOTE: IT IS CRITICAL TO HAVE A GOOD CREW FOR RETURNING EQUIPMENT BACK INTO THE SHED – PLEASE stay with us to help with this critical job. Everyone is tired by this point and more volunteers gets the job done faster!**

### Quilt Show Classes 2009

The quilt show is fast approaching. If you were thinking that you would like to take a class and just haven't gotten around to sending your registration in, please do so as soon as possible. As of Sunday, May 3, the following classes have a few openings. A full description of each class can be found at [www.quiltersunlimited.org](http://www.quiltersunlimited.org).

**Spend your lunch break learning!** Don't want to work, but love to learn? Then our box lunch lectures are for you! For a fee of \$10 (which includes a box lunch) on Friday, June 5, you can experience the "Nine-Patch Trunk show" by **Ann Littleton**, who will demonstrate many versatile, complex, and interesting uses of the nine-patch; or on Saturday, June 6 sit in on "Short Cuts from a Short Woman" by **Debby Kratovil**, who will bring you a trunk show bursting with tips, tricks, short cuts and a variety of innovations that will satisfy any quilter. Both classes start at 12:30 p.m.

Reservations and prepayment of lunch fee are required by May 29th. Please use the registration form.

**Pam Clarke** is a fabulous longarm quilter who has quilted over 7,500 quilts since 1988. Not only is she a talented quilter, but she has developed a technique for making quilts that can be applied to all methods of quilting, including hand quilting. Having Pam here from Washington State is a bonus. Usually one would travel a long distance with additional costs, but having her here locally is such a wonderful opportunity.

Class 103 - a lecture about her Designs with Lines technique.

Class 104 - Triangle Tango will show you how to do custom work with triangles and flying geese in a continuous motion.

Class 200 - Fearless Beginnings lecture is designed to save time and gain confidence. This class will have a special focus on the mid-arm machine (Handy-Quilter type) to teach you how to make the most out of your quilting space. (This was formerly Sunday class 403. It is now on Saturday from 9:30am to 12:30pm for \$60.)

Class 204 (now combined with class 304) - this is the hands on (practical) part of Designs with Lines. There will be longarm machines in the classroom for you to work on. This is a great opportunity to try these machines if you have been curious about them. The 2<sup>nd</sup> part of the class, Custom Quilting Block to Block, is guaranteed to change the way you approach your next quilt and will cover quilt marking and even basic patterns to create unlimited designs

**Jo Moury** is the GURU of EQ6!

Class 108 - Quilt It - You will explore various quilting designs for sample quilts to change the mood of your quilt. Participants will have the opportunity to thoroughly explore placing designs on the third layer in EQ6 as well as modifying EQ designs.

**Debby Kratovil** is a very talented quilter. You will have two quilts at the end of each of her classes.

Class 203 - Rainbow Strips and Curves

Class 406 - Snow Crystals and Diamond Head

**Patsy Thompson** is a free motion quilting teacher.

Class 206 - Yes There's Life After Stippling is for quilters who feel they have mastered stippling and want to take their quilting to a new level.

Class 405 - You will learn trapunto, fusible appliqué, thread painting, and free motion quilting while making a Pansy Wall Hanging.

**Patty Kerns** has produced many beautiful handbags.

Class 401 - Best Friends Forever Bag is quick and easy and a snap to create! The pattern includes two sizes with multiple finishing options. There will be a bonus thrown in at the end of class.

**Donna Ruppert** loves quilts from the 19<sup>th</sup> century.

Class 305 - Triangle Tricks features the Bird In the Air block pieced in a fast, fun and easy way.

Class 306 - Small Wonders will introduce essential concepts and techniques to help you work on a small scale.

Class 404 - Precisely Pieced Stars will help you create accurate blocks.

**Bonnie Hunter** is the Queen of scrap quilting.

Class 302 - Scrap Users System lecture. Have you ever stopped to realize that your scraps cost you just as much per yard as the original fabric purchased that they came from?

Class 402 - Jared Takes a Wife is another fabulous scrap quilt. Special yardage and scraps combine to create this quilt!

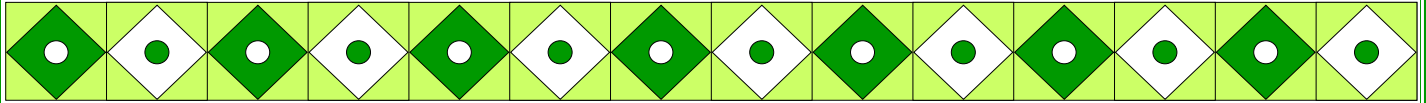
The block exchange was a big success with 95 Whirligig blocks turned in along with 26 Sun Bonnet Sue blocks. The blocks were divided into sets and nine sets went home with happy winners. The scavenger hunt, designed to have participants meet members from other chapters, got people talking and it was eventually discovered that there was more than one member present who has granny's bonnets growing in her garden (granny's bonnets is but one name for aquilegia or columbine). 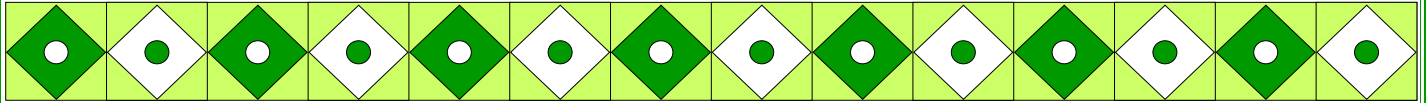
